We joined the Diversity in Agriculture Leadership program in 2018, and since then, our view that women play a vital role in the operation and management of Australia's cotton farms has strengthened. I am confident that over the year ahead we will continue to find ways for our female staff to develop their skills further and assume leadership roles and opportunities in our industry.
